Georgia Bio Legislative Report February 28, 2020

Days 17-21 of 40 Day Session

GENERAL UPDATE:

This week <u>SB 359</u> "Surprise Billing Consumer Protection Act" sponsored by Senator Chuck Hufstetler was unanimously passed/adopted by the Senate on February 24th. Additionally, <u>SB 303</u> "Georgia Right to Shop Act" sponsored by Senator Ben Watson relating to greater transparency of prices of nonemergency health care services was passed/adopted by the Senate on February 25th. These bills are headed to the House for consideration.

This morning the House Special Committee On Access to Quality Health Care passed <u>HB 888</u>, <u>HB 918</u>, <u>HB 946</u>, and <u>HB 952</u> relating to pharmacies, surprise billing, and pharmacy benefit managers. These bills are now headed to the House Rules Committee.

GEORGIA LIFE SCIENCES DAY AT THE STATE CAPITOL:

Georgia Bio celebrated the life science industry at the Georgia State Capitol February 25, 2020. During our day at the Georgia State Capitol, Georgia Bio had over thirty members in attendance focused on discussing with legislatures workforce & talent initiatives, patient access to care, and the creation of a Georgia Rare Disease Advisory Council. Georgia Bio received special recognition on the Georgia House of Representatives chamber floor and Georgia Senate gallery.

SB 415 - Civil Practice and Litigation; several titles of the O.C.G.A.; amend and revise

Bill Author: Senator Steve Gooch (R- Dahlonega)

Bill Status: Senate Read and Referred February 21, 2020

Summary: SB 415 relates to a lawsuit reform package to streamline the process of litigation and reduce

costs for Georgia's industries, small businesses, and citizens.

SB 426 - Air Quality; reporting of any unpermitted release of ethylene oxide to the Environmental Protection Division of the Department of Natural Resources; provide

Bill Author: Senator Brian Strickland (R - McDonough) **Bill Status:** Senate Read and Referred February 24, 2020

Summary: SB 426 relates to air quality, to provide for the reporting of any unpermitted release of ethylene oxide to the Environmental Protection Division of the Department of Natural Resources within 24 hours.

SB 427 - Medicaid; actuarial study of the fiscal impact of carving out pharmacy benefits;

Department of Community Health; require

Bill Author: Senator Jeff Mullis (R - Chickamauga)

Bill Status: Senate Read and Referred February 25, 2020

Summary: SB 427 requires the Department of Community Health to engage an actuary to conduct an actuarial study of the fiscal impact of carving out pharmacy benefits from the state's current Medicaid care management organizations.

SB 433 - 'Diabetes Drug Pricing Transparency Act of 2020'; disclosure of diabetes prescription drug pricing; require

Bill Author: Senator Burt Jones (R - Jackson)

Bill Status: Senate Read and Referred February 25, 2020

Summary: SB 433 requires the disclosure of diabetes prescription drug pricing to provide for a listing of diabetes prescription drugs, drug manufacturer and pharmacy benefits manager report forms and insurer pricing reports.

HB 991 - Healthcare Transparency and Accountability Act; enact

Bill Author: Rep. Matt Hatchett (R - Dublin)

Bill Status: House Second Readers on February 25, 2020

Summary: HB 991 provides transparency relating to state healthcare plans and its contractors.

HB 1027 - Insurance; rebates received from pharmaceutical manufacturers, provide requirements

Bill Author: Rep. Lee Hawkins (R - Gainesville)

Bill Status: House Second Readers on February 27, 2020

Summary: HB 1027 relating to regulation and licensure of pharmacy benefits managers to provide certain

requirements relating to rebates received from pharmaceutical manufacturers.
