

Georgia Bio Legislative Watch February 14, 2022 Legislative Days 12 - 15

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Business continued at the Capitol last week with a full committee schedule. A substitute to House Bill, the bill to establish a Rare Disease Advisory Council (RDAC) in Georgia, was heard in the House Health & Human Services Committee on Tuesday where it was unanimously voted out. The bill now goes before House Rules to be considered before a vote of the full House.

The Senate also passed Senate Bill 338 during Monday's floor session. This bill would extend postpartum Medicaid coverage for new mothers from six months to one year. SB 338 has been assigned to the House Health & Human Services Committee.

We anticipate this week being a busy committee week with <u>HB 1176</u>, the Right to Repair legislation, expected to be in the House Agriculture Committee as well as <u>HB 1013</u>, House leadership's Mental Health Parity bill, being heard in House Health & Human Services on Wednesday. We are preparing testimony to give on HB 1176 during Tuesday's Agriculture committee, so please send an email to Ashley Haltom (<u>ahaltom@cghi.org</u>) if you or someone from your company has input or would like to testify—this can also be submitted as written testimony.

Finally, we are working with Governor Kemp's office on a proclamation recognizing Monday, February 28th at Rare Disease Day in Georgia.
